



Environmental Educator Position Description

Position Summary:

The Environmental Educator plans, and implements outdoor, environmental education programs for elementary school groups, youth groups and general visitors. This school-year position (32 weeks) typically works 27 hours per week, from 8:45 am-3:00 pm, Monday-Friday and occasionally Saturday. (Dates and times have flexibility based on scheduling)

Duties & Responsibilities:

- Lead outdoor environmental education programs for youth and school groups at Blandford Nature Center.
- Maintain high standards of safety and well-being of program participants.
- Assist in the development of environmental education curriculum.
- Assist in the maintenance and storage of program equipment, supplies and facilities.
- Assist in documentation and evaluation of all programs including participant satisfaction and program effectiveness.
- Assist with other educational duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Three years of experience in the field of education, environmental sciences, natural sciences, biology, or related field.
- Two years' experience previously teaching/working with elementary age school students.
- Positive and energetic role model in attitude and behavior.
- Excellent judgment, reliability and ability to work independently.
- Ability to work effectively with students in the outdoors, in all types of weather and over uneven terrain.
- Ability to work effectively with all Blandford Nature Center staff and volunteers.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Competency in Microsoft Office and Google Documents.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in Environmental Education or related field.
- Experience in outdoor education and/or camp settings.
- Ability to speak the Spanish language fluently.
- Experience working with students from diverse backgrounds and cultures.
- CPR and First Aid certification.

Compensation:

This is a paid, up to 27 hour per week, non-exempt position with an minimum hourly wage of \$10.50 an hour. This position qualifies for paid holidays and annual leave.
